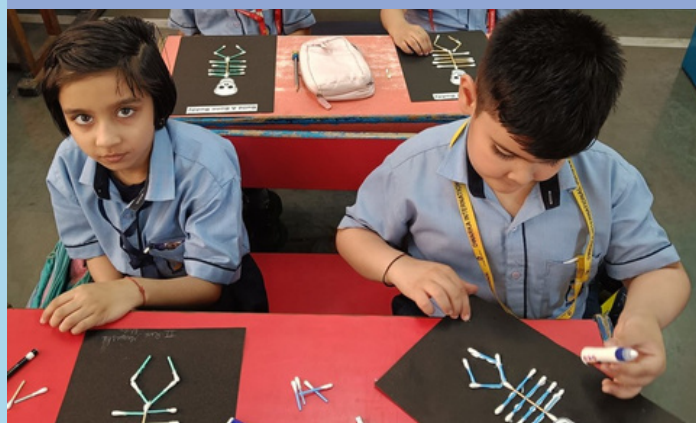
CLASS II ACTIVITY NOUN DETECTIVES ACTIVITY

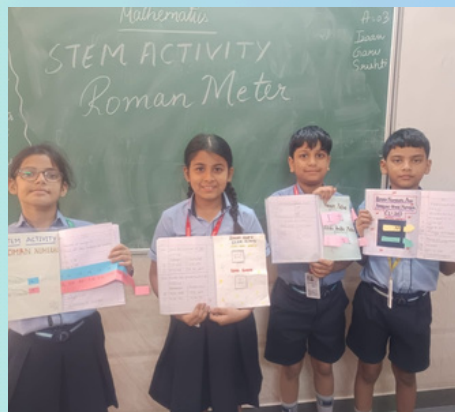
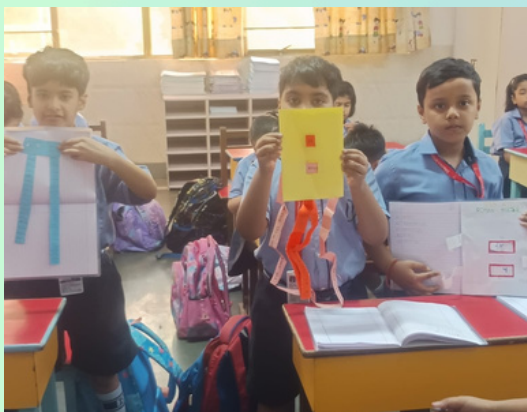
Rough Map of My Neighbourhood

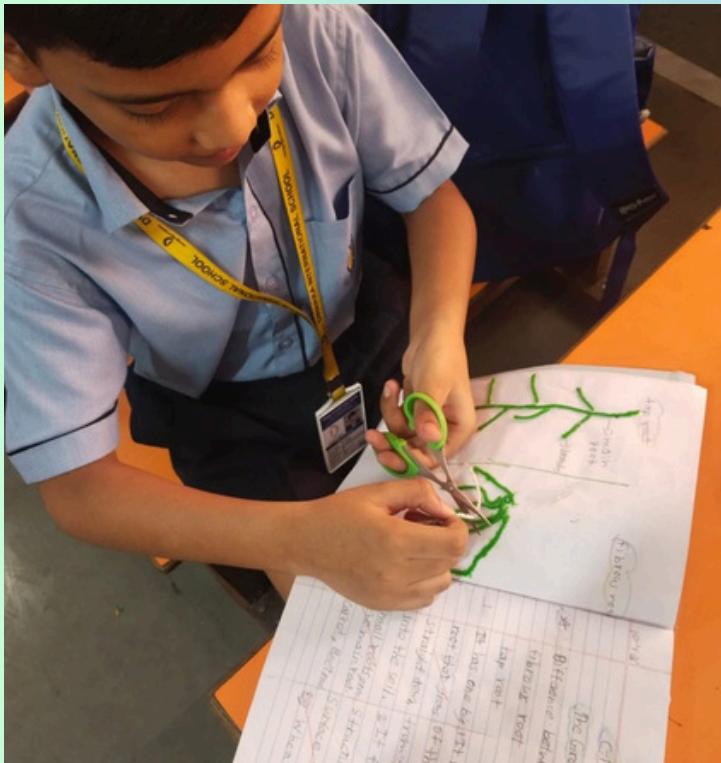


STEM MATHS ACTIVITY ROMAN METER

EARTH DAY - “DON'T BE MEAN, GO GREEN”

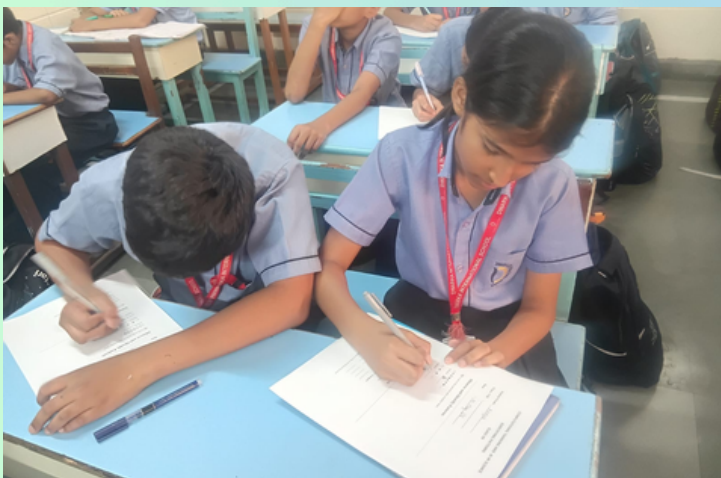

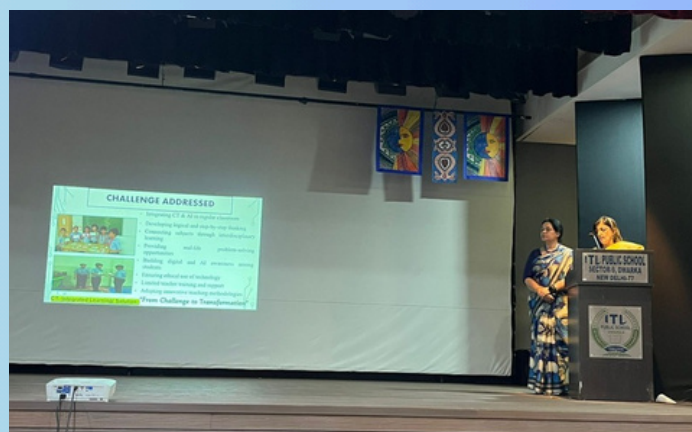
Echoes of Stone, Stories Untold: A Learning Journey to Qutub Minar

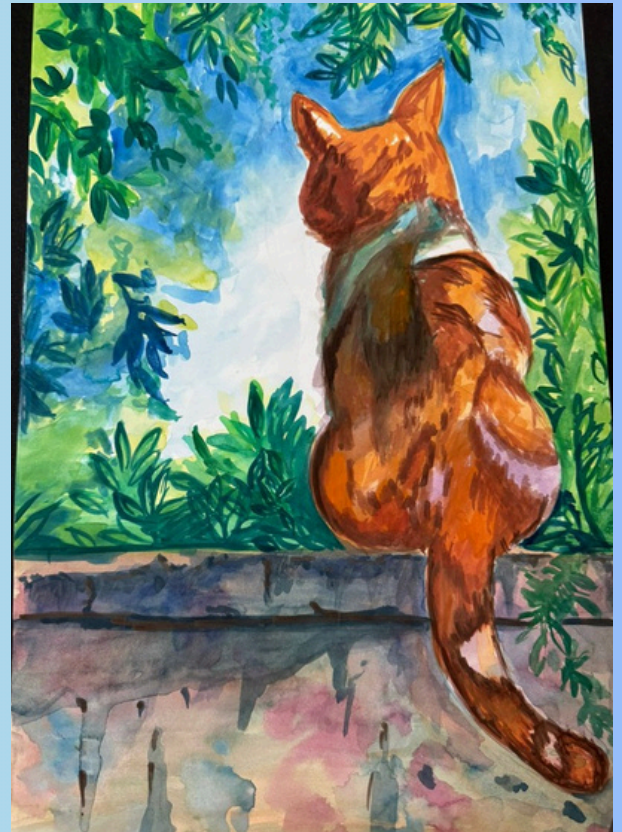

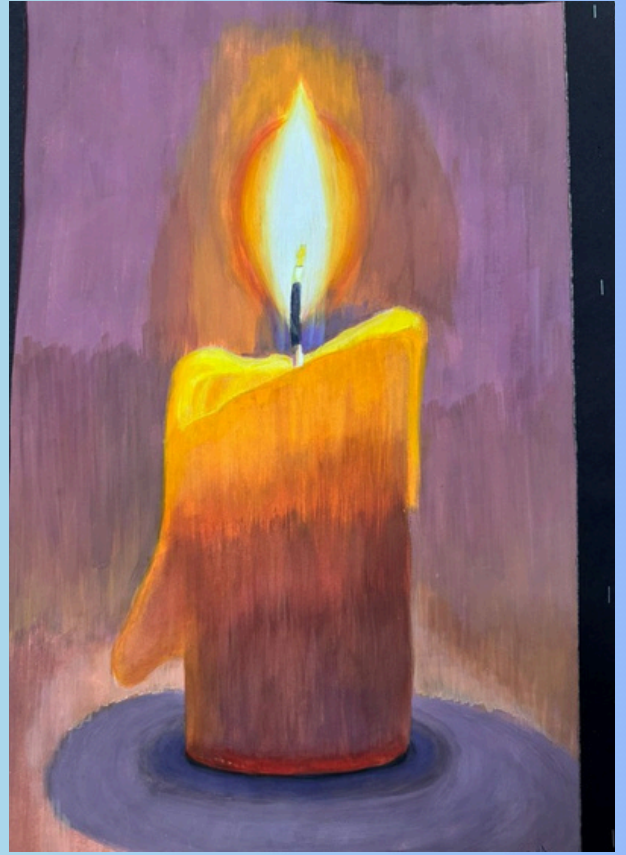
